The ticket is valid for 1, 2, or 3 calender days from first check in. A day in this context begins at 0:00 AM and ends the next day at 4:00 AM.

With this ticket you always check in when boarding and check out when getting off the bus or tram. For metro or train you check in and out at the station (platform).

Amsterdam City

Tram 1 (GVB)

Route: Central Station - Osdorp De Aker

Tram 1 will take you right through the centre of Amsterdam to the bustling Leidseplein. At the tram stop Dam you can find the Royal Palace and National Monument. At the Leidseplein stop you will find cinemas, bars, restaurants and various theatres. Tram 1 departs in front of Central Station on the "B" side.

Tram 9 (GVB)

Route: Central Station - Diemen

Tram 9 will take you right through the centre of Amsterdam to the famous Rembrandtplein with cinemas, bars, restaurants and clubs. This line can also be used for the Hermitage Museum at tram stop Waterlooplein. Tram 9 also stops close to Artis Royal Zoo at stop Plantage Kerklaan. Tram 9 departs in front of Central Station on the "A" side.

Tram 2 and 5 (GVB)

Route: Central Station - Nieuw Sloten / Binnenhof

Trams 2 and 5 will take you right through the centre of Amsterdam to the Museum Quarter with Van Gogh museum, Riiksmuseum and Stedeliik museum. There are many hotels situated around Museumplein. Trams 2 and 5 depart in front of Central Station on the "B" side, 8-12x/

Tram 13 and 17 (GVB)

Route: Central Station - Geuzenveld / Dijkgraafplein

Trams 13 and 17 will take you to the Jordaan, undoubtedly the most sung about, described and romanced town district in Amsterdam. Started as a district for the poor, today it is a favourite place for students, artists and young professionals. Close to tram stop Westermarkt you'll find the Anne Frank House, where she wrote her world-famous diary while hiding in occupied Holland. Trams 13 and 17 depart in front of Central Station on the "B" side.
